love and acceptance. Very slowly, Yoko has learned to read her Bible, say a simple prayer and sing praises to Jesus. Everyone in our congregation is amazed at the joy this has brought into her eyes and life. Yoko now understands who Jesus is, and that He died for her sins on the cross. In contrast to her father and two elder siblings, Yoko and her mother have found peace with God through the blood of Jesus.

Yoko's father has approved her wish to get baptized. The testimonies of both Yoko and her mother have moved his heart. He has even

allowed a cell group to meet in their newly renovated home for Bible studies. What an amazing transformation this is! Please pray for Yoko's family as she prepares for baptism. May Yoko's leap of faith be an inspiration for all in her home. Jesus may not always choose to heal every physical wound, but He always heals the broken-hearted and contrite, who wish to be saved. "I had to become a Christian," answered Ken, one of the 26 men that day in the English Bible Study. It seemed an odd answer to the question of how he had made the decision to follow Christ, a

decision that is normally made quite freely. But Ken went on to share that he had been sentenced to death, and in facing the reality of eternity, he was "forced" to also face the reality of God. Amazingly, his sentence was reversed, and today Ken is one of the strong Christians in the class.

For Jerry, the decision was also made after entering prison. He once wrote: "In 2006, when I was in prison, I sank into depression and felt numb for a long time. I thought everything was gone and nothing could encourage me anymore." He explained that he found a Bible in his cell. As he opened it he was touched by 2 Corinthians 5:17, "Therefore, if

anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" He was also touched by the unconditional love he experienced in the English Bible Study. God was mightily at work in his heart and eventually he made the decision to follow Christ.



Johnny, who is something of a class clown, will quite honestly admit that he

is not a Christian. But he has also talked about being touched by the great love he feels in the English Bible Study.

Please pray for these men. Pray that those like Johnny would open their hearts to Christ. Pray that those like Ken and Jerry would continue to grow in their faith and would shine for Christ in those dark prison cells. And pray for the others, that they too would make that life-changing decision!

To Japan's Tsunami-Stricken Northeast With Love By Michiyo Fujita

On March 11, 2011, a 9.0 magnitude earthquake, triggering 23-foot tall tsunami waves, hit the Northeastern coast of Japan. Complicated by a nuclear disaster due to damaged reactors, over 26,000 people are now dead, injured or missing.

The survivors in this area are more open than ever to hearing God's Word. To Japan's Northeast Liberty Corner Mission is therefore sending workers. Let's hear from one of them:

My name is Michiyo Fujita and I am a member of Kotake Mukaihara Christian Church in Tokyo. Every month I travel to the tsunami-stricken area near Sendai to share Jesus with the survivors. Sometimes others go with me and sometimes I go alone.



Near the coast, all the houses have been washed away, including most of their inhabitants. After the disaster, many volunteers came from all over Japan and from all over the world. Samaritan's Purse was one of the groups from America that came to repair damaged houses and clean out mud and debris. While in Sendai I met Mrs. Ito, who also has a house that was repaired by them.

Before this disaster, she didn't know anything about God, or church, or the Gospel. Through Samaritan's Purse, she became acquainted with Jesus. Because of the love of the volunteers, their sacrifice, and their faith, she began attending church and reading the Bible. She came to know Jesus as Savior, and she even introduced her daughter to our Kotake church, since her daughter is a student in Tokyo.

As a result of this disaster there are many like Mrs. Ito, who through the love and devotion of strangers met the God of the Bible for the first time. But now, after three years, almost all the volunteers have left. The survivors of this catastrophe are in deep emotional and spiritual need. They experienced such horrific tragedy, yet live on, and most of their inner reserves have been used up. They feel injured and wounded in heart, having lost spouses, parents, children, homes, occupations and security. They need peace in their hearts and salvation for their souls.
