

For the past three years, the Short Term Missions (STM) Team from Rutgers Community Christian Church in New Jersey has been helping to make it possible. The American team members use creative methods to teach English to the children who come. ## Taiwan

When people come to know the Lord, it's always glorious and exciting. On June 2, our church had the privilege of baptizing a mother and son together.

Ms. T. and her son live with her 92-year-old father and have had a troubled history. Growing up in a typical Taiwanese family, they worshipped various deities at

neighborhood temples. But ever since she was a young adult, Ms. T. had been plagued by what seemed to be demonic forces and manifestations. As is often the case, these afflicted people go from temple to temple to try to find a solution. Some of her symptoms were similar to those of epilepsy, so she also tried the western medicine route. Since

many doctors do not give credence to anything except purely physical causes for medical problems, two doctors at different, wellrespected hospitals tested Ms. T. extensively. Both concluded that she did not have epilepsy.

Someone introduced her to us, and after getting to know her, we discovered that there seemed to be a demonic source to her problems. Our assistant has had more contact to Ms. T. and her son than I, but one day when I was present she just could not bring herself to say "Jesus is Lord" and went into what seemed to be convulsions. After invoking the name of Jesus and commanding the evil spirits to leave her, she was able to smile and confess Jesus, not only as Savior, but gradually and firmly, as her Lord. She then expressed her strong desire to be baptized. Normally, we would wait until the next appointed time for baptism, but this was a special case, so we held the baptismal service at an earlier date. As of this writing, she and her son have come to church every Sunday since their baptism, have been warmly welcomed into our church, and continue to receive individualized spiritual care. Please pray with us that Ms. T. will keep the door of her old life shut while continually seeking Jesus, the only source of peace and eternal life. In a future article, I'll tell you more about her son. Thank you for your prayer for us and those to whom we minister.

Since the RCCC Short Term Missions Team returned to the States two weeks ago, I have begun the next portion of my journey, which involves staying here in Tokyo by myself. Even if I have to adjust

to life here and to overcome many language barriers, I thank God each day for this precious opportunity to serve the Japanese people. While I am here I will be teaching English classes weekly at church for young children, high school/university students, and adults. Through these classes, I pray that God will bring in many non-Christians whom I can get to know better and befriend, even if I cannot speak their language!

Although my journey has just begun, I know that God is already at work in this country and that He has many wonderful things in store for the people here who do not know Him yet. Please pray that God will continue to use me and show me how I can serve Him and those around me each day. Thank you for your support and prayers!
