Three evangelistic outreaches! Each was planned and carried out by one of the three cell groups in our church! Normally, we sponsor just one larger evangelistic church event, but because many people in Taiwan still are cautious under the cloud of Covid-19, we decided to keep each outreach on a smaller scale. New people would be more likely to attend a gathering if there were fewer people present.



Each cell group conducted its own event at different locations. One of the groups was able to prearrange the use of a small restaurant owned by a Christian, about 45 minutes away. There they were served a meal, followed by a time of worship. The climax of the evening was the moving testimony of a former prisoner, converted by the power of the Gospel, who was a

friend the owners of the restaurant. Another group used one of the members’ out-of-town dealership locations, not far from the ocean. After playing on the beach and being blessed by the magnificence of the setting sun, they enjoyed an outdoor barbeque, singing together, and a pertinent Gospel message. The third group met at our church, where they dined, viewed a Christian film, and established relationships with the non-Christians present. Each cell group had unbelievers attending, and we prayerfully anticipate God’s Spirit to continue His work in their hearts. May many of these unbelievers come to a saving faith in Jesus.

In retrospect, the decision to have separate cell group outreach events was actually good, because each individual group was responsible to make its own event a success by planning, praying, and working. This helps to further establish a cell group church culture, which is where we want to go. When individuals take personal responsibility in reaching their friends and relatives, God’s Kingdom grows. Mr. K’s wife had been working at a Christian nursery school for over ten years. She was familiar with the Bible and attended worship with the children every day, but didn’t believe in her heart what she was hearing about the Lord. To her, attending these meetings was just a part of her job.



Yet through several major trials in her life, God’s love led her to be saved! The first was through the disappearance of her elderly mother, who suffers from dementia. As Mrs. K desperately searched for her, she also asked Christian friends to pray. One friend said, “Don’t worry. **God is waiting for you, and is holding your mother’s hand.**” Later that night, her mother was found. Someone had noticed the anxious state of this woman late at night and kept her safe. Later Mrs. K said,

“God was really **waiting for me while holding my mother’s hand!**”

Another trial was the painful experience of being betrayed by someone she had trusted with all her heart. Through her grief, anger, and unspeakable suffering, she realized that only God’s unchangeable and unfailing love, which had been poured out from the Cross, was worthy of her trust.
